

The Lake Conroe Lions Club presented a check to the Texas Lions Camp for \$7,000 as a result of their fund raiser.



WOMEN'S MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT AND PARTICIPATION COMMITTEE

The recruitment and participation of women in Lions is a critical element of the International Program this year. This is the year of "Innovation", President Lee's theme. The mission is clear, we must encourage women to join Lions, in our service to the community and the world, and to encourage them to advance in the leadership of District 2-S2. Figures given to me by Lions International are as follows: as of May 31, 2003 there were 577 Women Lions in District 2-S2. Figures reported by Lions International as of November 30, 2003 indicate we have 550 Women Lions in District 2-S2.

Our District figures indicate from July 01, 2003 through December 31, 2003 there is good news. We have added 58 new women lions. The bad news is we have lost 60, leaving us with a deficit of minus 2.

In July, President Lee set the goal for each district to have a net gain of 25 women members. To meet this goal for Governor Melba, we must recruit 27 new women members to make up the loss and add the additional 25.

With the help of the women's induction fee waiver we have been given a recruiting incentive. The form for secretaries to send in is in this District newsletter. For a club to receive credit this form must be returned with the MMR. I am organizing a committee of District 2-S2 women Lions to assist in recruiting women. With their help and the cooperation of club presidents we can show Lions International what a proud district we are.

Some eyeglass history — Encyclopedia Britannica

Roger Bacon in 1268 recorded the earliest comment on the optical use of lenses, but magnifying glasses inserted in frames were used for reading in Europe and China at about the same time. Whether the West learned from the East or vice versa is controversial. Eyeglasses made their First European appearance in Italy.

Originally lenses were made of transparent quartz and beryl (of which aquamarine is a variety), but increased demand led to the adoption of optical glass. The availability of lenses not only aided ocular efficiency but to the invention of the microscope (1590) and of the telescope (1608). In 1784 Benjamin Franklin invented bifocals, dividing his lenses for distant and near vision, the split parts being held together by the frame.

Cemented bifocals were invented in 1884, and the fused and one - piece types followed in 1908 and 1910, respectively. Trifocals and new designs in bifocals were later introduced, including the Franklin bifocal revived in one - piece form, to satisfy more adequately diverse optical problems and occupational needs.
