District Governor C.W. "Buzz" Goins

The District Convention is upon us. VDG Margaret and her crew of "super persons" have done a predictably outstanding job of setting up the convention. The price has been set at the lowest price in many years - \$99.00 for five good, if not outstanding, meals is truly a bargain in anyone's budget. Getting \$139.00 per day rooms for \$82.00 plus service charge and \$189.00 Suites for \$92.00 plus service charge is a rare bargain. It is good to report that we have met our room commitment, and in fact, now rooms are "iffy" and may not be available at the low rate. For every thing good there is an equally bad thing, the meal count is down considerably. The prediction for the meal count was based on last year's meal count - without an increase. We may be paying for some meals that we do not eat; sad, so sad!

Again some good has occurred in that the convention book ad sales were up almost 25%. This provides a lot of much needed subsidy for the convention. It certainly makes the low priced food income look good in the final accounting.

Alas (and maybe "gadzooks"), more bad stuff in the wind. It is reported that barely fifty (50) percent of the eligible club delegates vote in our elections. (I'm afraid to ask how many clubs even bother to send in the delegate assignment form. Last year only 127 delegates were registered and 123 of these actually voted.) In my estimation and by any unit of measure, this is not good! District 2-S2 has 1800-plus members, and that says we are entitled to at least 180 delegates from the clubs to the District Convention, plus the PDGs and PIDs, who are automatically assigned delegate status, for a total of over 200 voters. Is this some flawed philosophy coming down from the City, State and National elections? We are just barely beating the turnout for the "local" elections. This certainly makes a deprecating statement about some club officers as well as those appointed delegates who do not bother to vote. From a logical view, membership alone may not our problem; it apparently goes the quality and character of the member. Ergo, "Dear Brutus, the fault lies within our selves." I do not subscribe to the prevalently held theory that elections are a waste and have no meaning, and I do hold those who advocate such drivel in the highest possible disdain and contempt. I have slipped into a rant, for which I apologize.

Hope to see you at the District Convention especially if you're a Delegate. This convention belongs to all the members of 2-S2 so be there and show your support for Lionism.

Don't forget the MD-2 Convention in Abilene and the International Convention in Boston. Has your club paid the \$45.00 for the Jimmy Ross Parade? We, as a district, must support the last Texan to become President of Lions Clubs International that most of us will ever see. Times are a-changing, and if we have to go to the rear of the line, let us go in a grand and glorious style.

Honoring Lion Jack Rafferty April 16, 2006

Jack joined the Hempstead Lions Club in 1970 and in June of this year, Jack would have been a member of the Hempstead Lions Club for 36 years with over 31 years of perfect attendance. Jack was not content with just being a member. He served in various offices of his club including: Director of the Board, Secretary/Treasurer, Vice President, President, Membership Committee Chairman, Bulleting Editor, and was chairman of many fund-raising projects. He was a Master Key Member, having sponsored 32 new Lions.

Jack has been awarded honors as Hempstead Lions Club Lion of the Year, Life Membership in the Texas Lions Camp and Century Club Member of the Camp. He was a Life Member of the Lions Eye Bank and Charter Lions Eye Bank Ambassador Member. Twice he received the Melvin Jones Fellowship, the highest award to be bestowed for humanitarian efforts. Additionally, he received the coveted Lions International District Governor's Excellence Award in recognition of his service to Lionism, being only one of two Texas Governors awarded this distinction for the year 1993-1994, and Lions International awarded him the 100% District Governor's Award and the Lions International President's Medal during his term of service.

While District Governor, Lion Jack served as Council Treasurer, and was instrumental in establishing the District 2-S2 Hall of Fame Award.

While Lion Jack was District Governor, Campaign Sight First was in full swing. This was a worldwide fundraising campaign to find a cure to prevent and eliminate blindness. Through his leadership, he was able to meet and exceed the \$340,000.00 goal set for District 2-S2 by Lions International. District 2-S2 ranked 2nd out of 16 Texas Districts in this endeavor.

Lion Jack loved his adoring wife, Lois, his family, his church, and golf. Maybe not in that exact order, but he did love playing golf. He has played at 450 different golf courses worldwide. He has a collection of over 26,864 golf balls with course logos on them. He has played on every golf course in Houston, except Lochinvar. But knowing Jack, he'll probably start playing new courses in Heaven.

We'll miss you Jack, but we'll never forget you. God bless you for all your contributions, for all the people you've helped. Your contributions will be your legacy.

The Past District Governors Association has renamed its annual golf tournament to be called "The Jack Rafferty Memorial Golf Tournament."





LIGHTNING STRIKES

Part I

A bolt of lightning can be two miles long, travel at the speed of light, reach 50,000 degrees and carry 100 million volts. The insulation on home and office electrical wires are rated for a maximum of 600 volts. Convenience receptacles and switches have a maximum

Convenience receptacles and switches have a maximum rating of 125 volts.

It stands to reason the integrity of the wire insulation and the receptacles and switches will be compromised by a lightning strike.

Additionally, there are transient voltages, surges and spikes which are prevalent in the utility company's power to homes and offices. Most computer chips will sustain some measure of damage if the voltage exceeds 150 volts. When air conditioning systems and refrigerator compressors kick in, the voltages in the electrical system will surge.

Some of the negative results of transient voltages, surges and spikes are light bulbs burn out, the integrity of micro chips in computers and household appliances are compromised, and refrigerator and air conditioner compressors do not run efficiently nor last as long as they should.

So how do we prepare for these daily challenges to electrical systems?

A surge suppression system would guard against long-term deterioration effects to computer chips and printed circuit boards. These items are in every appliance, computers, garage and gate openers, and entertainment systems. It also would assist in some protection from lightning strikes. However, nothing is fool-proof.

Most consumers are under the illusion they have protected electrical wiring systems together with their electronic equipment by purchasing multioutlet strips or whole-house suppressors from neighborhood hardware stores.

However, unless these suppressors have a clamping voltage not exceeding 150 volts per phase, and respond in less than five nano seconds, they have limited protection. In surge suppressors, clamping voltage is where the voltage will be limited to that amount by bleeding off or absorbing the excess voltage.


