Thought's from the Second Vice District Governor:

Recently my club held our annual Mop and Broom Sale with Caravan Sales for the Blind. It was a successful year and we were able to help raise money for a worthy cause. Each year part of our sales process involves loading up a few trucks with some of the merchandise and a few Lions and driving through some of the neighborhoods selling items door to door. Two thoughts are usually reinforced each year. The first thought is the amount of generous people we having living in my community. The second is that I am glad my door to door salesmanship is limited to one day a year. This year the door to door sales triggered another thought that was delayed until a day or two after the sale.

Somewhere during my three hours walking around my own neighborhood making the door to door sales, having dogs bark at me and seeing curtains move but no one answer the door, I made two unexpected sales. For those of you who don't know, my club has a flag program as a fundraiser. For \$35 a year, the Liberty Lions Club will place an American flag in your front yard on 7 holidays throughout the year. We put out well over a 1000 flags a year. It is our largest fundraiser and allows us to give a lot of money back to the community. Well twice someone told me they didn't need any cleaning supplies but asked how much the flag program was and then proceeded to pay for a flag. I thanked them and went on door to door selling mops and brooms and thanking people when they didn't buy anything. It wasn't until a day or two later that I realized the potential flag sales my club missed out on. Obviously there are people in my neighborhood that weren't participating in the flag program, two people signed up with me that day. I can forgive myself missing the lesson after the first flag sale, it was a warm day after all and I was focused on selling mops and brooms. After all, it was the mop and broom sale. But after a second person had to ask me about the flags for the sale to happen, you would think I might have caught on and started adding the flags to my sales pitch.

The point of this story isn't to talk about fundraising, but to bring home the point that sometimes we get so fixated on what we are trying to accomplish that we might miss out on another opportunity. Perhaps we are so focused on getting someone from a certain business or organization to become a member of our club that we considering another person we meet, who would make a fine Lion, doesn't even cross our mind. Maybe we are so locked in on our nominating committee process that we fail to see how much a Lion

has contributed to the club and perhaps they should be considered for a certain position. I'm not sure what we can do to make ourselves aware of situations like these when they are happening, I know I couldn't in the example above, but once we do recognize them hopefully we can address them. As for me, I've already made a reminder in my calendar for next year to ask my customers if they need a flag with that mop and broom.



Houston Blind Fury Dragon Boat Team

Since October 2006, when the first Lighthouse of Houston Blind Fury Team ventured out on the waters of Clear Lake to compete against normal sighted corporate and community teams in dragon boat racing, several members from this team have gone on to successfully pursue other activities or careers after gaining valuable confidence in their abilities to work together as a TEAM and to overcome any fears about themselves and others. This water sport requires that each individual develop their paddling strength and technique within a very confining, limited area on the boat while depending upon each other to work together in unison and synchronization to be successful in moving the boat forward. Not all the participants work out regularly in the gym or health clubs but, once a year, in late February, they begin meeting at the Lighthouse's indoor swimming pool and start refreshing themselves on what it takes to compete in these events. There are several regulars who have been with the team since the very beginning and it's always fun to see their smiling faces when we meet at the beginning of the season and build up the excitement again. The men and women who comprise the core of this team always share their experiences with the newcomers and it's interesting to see how they all handle the strenuous paddling exercises and drills that all are required in preparation for the upcoming races in downtown Houston.

This year, again, on Saturday, May 4, 2013, at Allen's Landing on Buffalo Bayou, the 13th Annual Dragon Boat Festival will be held. It's free admission to the General Public and there's plenty of entertainment and food vendors as well as the main attraction, which is dragon boat racing. In this festive environment, the Lighthouse Blind Fury Team will be competing again against local corporate and community teams. If you have some free time, beginning from 9:00 AM to around 4:00 PM, please come out and watch/cheer on a very inspiring team of visually impaired or blind mixed gender team of competitors!

Several local District 2S2 Lions Clubs have been instrumental in assisting this club financially in recent years by helping to fund their entry fee into the festival or to cover some of their refreshment costs since they are required to remain at the race site for the entire day. But times are tough for many clubs and funding has been more selective among the various district projects requiring assistance, so, if there is any ability to assist this worthy team activity, please forward a contribution to the Lighthouse of Houston in this regard and indicate that it's intended for the 2013 Blind Fury Dragon Boat Team.

Dear Lions of District 2-S2,

Each year our district collects funds to provide free transportation for handicapped children to and from the Texas Lions Camp in Kerrville. This service allows parents to save the time, money, and worry of driving 5 hours to the camp and back. Most of the children that we transport would not otherwise be able to go to the camp and would miss out on that life-changing experience.

We only use the top-of-the-line bus service (with handicapped lifts) and only the top driver in the Houston area, Rusty Roberts. Rusty is not a Lion, but he has the heart of a true Lion. Each year he donates his salary for the trips so that we keep our costs down. District 2-S2 is very grateful to Rusty for his service and for his generousity.

Now comes our part! We need money to continue to provide this service. Each trip to bring kids to the camp costs \$1752.40 and each trip to return them to Houston is another \$1752.40. The total costs of the six trips is \$10,514.40. At this writing, approximately \$6000 have been raised, \$4000 of which was carry-over from last year. To make expenses for Camper Transportation this year, we need to raise another \$5000. What would be nice is to raise over \$5000, so that funds can carry over to the summer of 2014.

Please consider either club donations or individual donations sometime in the next three months so that our Houston area campers can benefit from the Lions Camp experience.

Texas Lions Camp Transportation District 2-S2

Dear Fellow Lions,

The purpose of Camp Transportation is to provide free transportation for parents of children who cannot drive their kids to the camp. Because of this service provided by District 2-S2, we have many more campers from the Houston area than we would have otherwise.

Leaving from Memorial City Shopping Center on Sunday mornings, the children are transported to the camp in Kerrville by top-of-the-line buses. The following Saturdays, the children are picked up by the bus and returned to Houston. Lion volunteers from all over the district ride the buses to monitor and assist the children. It is a wonderful experience to ride the buses and connect with Lions Camp campers. You will meet some very excellent young kids.

How Can You Help

1) **Spread the word.** You can tell any parents of children attending the camp that transportation is avaiable to them. Here are the dates:

Session 3

Sunday, June 23rd – Children check in starting at 8:00 AM. The bus leaves at 9:00 AM. Saturday, June 29th – Bus leaves at 5:00 AM and returns the children at 3:00 PM(ish).

Session 4

Sunday, June 30th – Children check in starting at 8:00 AM. The bus leaves at 9:00 AM. Saturday, July 6th – Bus leaves at 5:00 AM and returns the children at 3:00 PM(ish).

Session 5

Sunday, July 7th – Children check in starting at 8:00 AM. The bus leaves at 9:00 AM. Saturday, July 13th – Bus leaves at 5:00 AM and returns the children at 3:00 PM(ish).

- 2) You can help fund the bus transportation. The cost to the district is approximately \$10,000 for the six trips. Several clubs in our district are very generous with their contributions. There are a number of Lions who also donate as individuals. Please consider donating to the camper transportation fund. You can do this in two ways: A) give at the PSC or Cabinet Meetings during the "Parade of Checks." B) You can send a check, made out to District 2-S2 (noting that it is for "Camper Transportation"), to: Ralph Reed, 705 Main St. Unit 315, Houston, TX 77002.
- 3) You can volunteer to ride the buses. Please consider riding the camp bus at least once this summer! Saturdays are the best time for two reasons: A) you can sleep all the way to Kerrville and B) the kids are so tired on the return back that they usually sleep all the way back, making it easy duty. Sundays are also nice, however there are a few more duties involved like checking in kids and wrangling their gear.


