How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2008. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Peace Begins With Me."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations in New York City, New York, USA (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$2,500 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2009.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.



Honoring Our Flag in June

With June 14th long established as Flag Day in the United States, it is important to honor the significance of our flag and to remember a few facts about the flag's origin and evolution.

Elizabeth Griscom Ross, a seamstress from Philadelphia, is said to have been the first person to make an American Flag. According to legend, a special committee of the Continental Congress visited her at her home in May 1776. They commissioned her to make a new flag for the Continental Army. Betsy Ross, as she came to be known, had made flags for ships in the upholstery business that she and her husband started. George Washington preferred a six-pointed star, but Betsy Ross convinced the Committee that five-pointed stars were more easily made. The circular motif in the blue canton was meant to show that not one of the new states was more important than another.




The 15-Star / 15-Stripe flag was adopted in May 1795 after the states of Vermont and Kentucky were admitted to the Union. It was this type of flag that flew over Fort McHenry in Baltimore that inspired Francis Scott Key to write the "Star Spangled Banner."

On April 4, 1818, President James Monroe signed a law stating that the flag would have only thirteen stripes and a star for every state. Tennessee, Ohio, Louisiana, Indiana and Mississippi had been added to the Union by 1818, bringing the number of states – and stars – to twenty. The law also said that new stars would be added to the flag on the Fourth of July following the admission of the new state.

On December 12, 1860, South Carolina seceded from the Union. By the end of January 1861, seven states had seceded, beginning what we know as the Civil War. By the end of 1861, eleven states composed the Confederate States of America: South Carolina, Mississippi, Florida, Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Texas, Virginia, Arkansas, North Carolina and Tennessee.

President Abraham Lincoln and the United States government did not recognize the Confederate States of America as a new nation. Instead, their secession was considered an insurrection within the Union. Because of this belief, President Lincoln refused to remove stars from the Union flag. At the beginning of 1861, the Stars and Stripes had thirty-three stars. Kansas joined the Union in 1861, West Virginia in 1863, and Nevada in 1864, although its star was not added to the flag until after the Confederacy surrendered.

On June 24, 1912, an executive order signed by President William Howard Taft standardized the proportions of the flag, the fly (length) and hoist (width) of the blue canton of stars, and the configuration of stars in six rows of eight with one point of each star pointing upward. At that time, forty-eight states made up the Union.



Robert G. Heft – a high school student, designed the current flag of the United States of America in 1958. Inspired by the news of Alaska and Hawaii becoming states, Heft spent a weekend arranging fifty stars on the blue field of the flag for a school project.


